- noxious weed lists,
- contact information for all state seed control officials,
- links to all state Seed Acts and Seed Rules.


What Seeds are Included?

This database was made possible through funding from an Oregon Department of Agriculture **Specialty Crop Block Grant**.

Currently, it includes only specialty crops from the FSA list of Agricultural and Vegetable seeds. Grains, forages, and oilseeds are excluded; however, when a state does not specifically regulate at the Turf & Lawn or Cool-Season level all FSA regulated Ag Seeds are included.

Welcome to the **OSA Seed Labeling Database**, your comprehensive resource for label compliance with U.S. state seed acts and rules. The resource was developed under the leadership of the OSA Science and Technology Committee and is available at no charge until end of 2025 thanks to funding from Oregon's Specialty Crop Block Grant Program. It includes up-to-date information for Truth-in-Labeling rules across all U.S. states for **turf and lawn grass seed products** as well as **vegetable seeds** grown in Oregon.

Designed for seed producers and distributors, our database helps navigate state-specific requirements related to labeling with "Variety not stated", origin, net weight, sell by dates, and more, ensuring compliance of inter-state shipped products with each state's rule and the Federal Seed Act. In addition, the database will provide contact information for all state seed officials and links to the relevant seed acts and rules. The database does not include information about seed quality standards like germination rates, maximum weed seed contents, etc. This information can be found in the state seed acts and rules, with links provided in the state overview section of the database.

States regulate seeds differently: some cover all Agricultural Seeds under one rule, while others create subcategories such as Turf & Lawn or even further subcategories, like Cool-season grasses. These distinctions are recorded in the database and used as a reference when reviewing state rules and regulations links.

Applied Rules: Regulatory Sources and Methodology

The database sources its information from official state seed acts and labeling regulations for agricultural seeds. While some states apply general agricultural seed labeling rules to turf and lawn products, others establish specific regulations for turf and lawn products or set distinct rules for cool-season turf and lawn grass seeds only. The database adheres to each state's regulatory framework, displaying the rules relevant to the specific turf and lawn seed product. If a state does not have a specific regulation for cool-season turf and lawn grass seeds, the database will display either the general turf and lawn grass seed rules or, where applicable, the general agricultural seed rules. The source of each data entry is displayed under "Applied Rules".

Application of Seed Labeling Laws to Warm-season Grass Seed Products

The only state with a distinct labeling rule for warm-season grass seed mixtures is Delaware. For warm-season grass seed products shipped to Delaware, the seed test remains valid for 9 months compared to 15 months for cool-season grass mixtures. Please note that, in general, tests remain valid for 9 months for agricultural seeds in Delaware.

The database does not include a selector for warm-season grass seed products, as other states have not adopted rules specific to warm-season grass seed.

Labeling Rules

Selecting Labeling Rules, the first button, directs you to the seed tagging requirements outlined by the FSA for Agricultural Seed labels. Most of this information comes directly from the seed lot's Certificate of Analysis and includes guidance on kind and variety labeling options.

Information mandated by the Federal Seed Act

The following information must be included in tags for seed shipped to other states and text must match test results where applicable:

** Agricultural seed, including turf and lawn grasses, has three options for labeling based on the FSA: (1) Kind name; (2) Kind and variety name; or (3) Kind name and the words "Variety not stated". Six Oregon grown turf/lawn grass seeds, and white and red clover must be labeled as to variety but the "Variety not stated" description is permitted for them (FSA §201.10). Please consult the database for states that apply stricter rules than the FSA and prohibit labeling seed products with "Variety not stated." The database does not specify if states allow labeling of turf and lawn grass seed by "crop kind only" or if "Variety not stated" is only permitted for select species.

*** Some states allow an alternative to "Date of test" to be printed on the label.

While not considered a specialty crop, clover is regulated differently under the FSA and by many states. When shipping Red or White clover, be sure to follow these specific requirements.
